not equitable public money funding private schools

students should not be blocked to a course due to financial reason. Not enough money to fund all students in need for things like an academy.

Equitable and segregated schools for special needs students Victor school K-12 for especially high needs students. and a program at Braefoot.

Students are excluded from community school.

IS the size of the school equitable: some students do better in small some do better in a large school.

Who are we expressing equity around. Best outcome for students, best for staffing. Itinerant teachers psychologist, speech paths etc.

Facilities: some schools are 'beautiful' some are older and need upgrading

technology available for schools

volunteer money. Volunteer hours. Some depends on neighbourhood, socioeconomic. Facilities rental fields, theatres. Other schools rent from facility. Spectrum with rock walls high expense to install WiFi. Each school receives allocation and then disperses as necessary. New schools would not need same amount of maintenance as older schools

Classes canceled due to low numbers can't run a class with 10 students. Need to start with 23/24 students.
