The October newsletter accompanies our first formal report card for the school year. In reviewing the student's marks and comments, I am amazed at how well our students have achieved. We have had another great start to the school year welcoming about 1175 students in September. Immediately we launched into another fundraising campaign for the Tour de Rock - see the article to the right. This is an excellent way for the school community to come together for a common cause. As you know we had the additional challenge of adding a number of new teachers to our school to meet the mandated class size limits. Between some turnover from last year, new teachers, four new office staff, new student support workers, a new youth and family counselor, and a new vice-principal, we had 38 new staff in total join us this year, with two more to come next week. While that in itself presented some challenges, we are very pleased with the new energy they have brought to our school. As you know the McKenzie Interchange Project continues, and to put it bluntly, traffic is a bit of a gong show our there. This is a friendly reminder to everyone to be careful and be mindful of the volumes of traffic. The beginning and end of the day are particularly busy, and we need your help to try and reduce the volume coming through our parking lot. If you daughter or son needs to be dropped off, doing so a few blocks away would be very helpful. And while we do remind our students to be careful when leaving the school, they can be a little inattentive as times. Patience is the order of the day, especially with our Supervisors! 
From the Visual Arts Department
