



CAREER EDUCATION

The Career Education Program is required for graduation

GRADE 10Career Life Education

Career Life Education is taken in class and focuses on personal development, connections to the community and career-life plans. The students' Capstone Portfolio begins here and is carried through to graduation. Topics include the following: goal setting, workplace etiquette, global trends, and employability skills, just to name a few. This course works in conjunction with and provides a base for the Career Life Connections course.

GRADE 11Career Life Connections: Part A

The first two of the four mandatory credits for Career Life Connections (CLC) are given to students as they complete CLC12A in Grade 11. CLC continues from the base that is set for the Career-Life courses in CLE10, focusing on the exploration of possible future career and life paths with the help of a mentor of their choice. Students will continue their Capstone Portfolio that begins in CLE10, complete professional documents, and network with various members of the local communities.

GRADE 12Career Life Connections: Part B

The final two of the four credits for Career Life Connections are given to students who complete CLC12B in Grade 12. Students will continue to collaborate with their mentor as they complete the work that they began in CLC12A in Grade 11. In addition, students are required to complete 30 hours of Experiential Learning, plan a budget for their near and distant futures, and finally, participate in a Capstone Showcase where all Grade 12's will celebrate their journeys through the Career Life Courses and their time at Spectrum.



BUSINESS **EDUCATION**

Are you a self-motivated individual with an entrepreneurial mindset? Do you want to make a difference in the world of business? Then look no further! The business department offers courses that teach you how to build a successful business while following governmental policies and maintaining ethical standards. The courses are designed so you can work ahead of the pace set in class.

The program begins with the introductory courses Entrepreneurship and Marketing for Grades 9 and 10. These courses lead to senior-level classes that explore topics such as how government structure and policies influence the economy, how businesses make informed decisions using data to maximize profits, and how to use technology to promote and boost sales.

A dual-credit program at the senior level is offered by Camosun College, in which you will complete online courses designed and led by Camosun professors. Upon completion, you will receive credits that can be applied to your post-secondary education. This is a fantastic way to get a head start and save money!



The digital media and game design department features several courses that accommodate all skill levels and focuses on active learning through hands-on activities.


The program begins with a Computer Basics course, where students learn the fundamentals of working with a desktop computer. This course is available at all grade levels.
