WHO IS FLEETWOOD MAC?

Fleetwood Mac was established in 1967 by guitarist Peter Green, drummer Mick Fleetwood, bassist John McVie, and guitarist Jeremy Spencer. Initially a blues band, they released their debut album in 1968, followed by *Mr. Wonderful* the same year and *Then Play On* in 1969. Their 1969 single "Albatross" topped the UK charts.

Peter Green left the band in 1970 due to mental health issues, leading to several lineup changes. Christine McVie (keyboards, vocals) and Danny Kirwan (guitar) joined, with Christine becoming a full-time member in 1970. The band's music gradually shifted from blues to soft pop rock.

In the early 1970s, Fleetwood Mac went through many changes. Jeremy Spencer left in 1971, and Danny Kirwan was fired in 1972. They faced some tough times, but albums like *Kiln House* (1970) and *Future Games* (1971) showed growth. Bob Welch joined as a guitarist and singer in 1971, but he left in 1974, causing another change.

In 1974, Lindsey Buckingham and Stevie Nicks joined the band, bringing a big change. Their first album with the band, Fleetwood Mac (1975), was very successful with hits like "Rhiannon" and "Landslide", giving the band a new, polished sound. By 1976, the lineup included Mick Fleetwood (drums), John McVie (bass), Christine McVie (keyboards, vocals), Lindsey Buckingham (guitar, vocals), and Stevie Nicks (vocals). This lineup set the stage for their famous album Rumours in 1977, which made them world-famous.

The creation of the album was referred to as "trauma" by Christine McVie. During this time, the band faced a lot of personal issues. Mick Fleetwood was dealing with his wife's affair, Christine and John McVie were divorcing, and Lindsey Buckingham and Stevie Nicks had just broken up. These emotional struggles influenced their songwriting, with many songs reflecting their heartbreak and tension.

The title of the album *Rumors* came from all the speculation and gossip around the bandmates and their social circle. Most of the album was recorded late into the night after the parties in the studios had stopped because no one could keep going. Then, after excessive cocaine and alcohol was consumed they would begin to record. Apparently this was the only way they could tolerate one another to get through recording a song.

PREAMS ****

Listen carefully to the sound of your loneliness Like a heartbeat that drives you mad In the stillness of remembering what you had

Dreams was Stevie Nicks response to her breakup with Lindsay Buckingham. The sentiments in the song are about her and Lindsay being cleansed by the rain, and coming out of the heartbreak as friends and better people.

Dreams was the only song by Fleetwood Mac that made it to number 1 on the american music charts



"Never Going Back Again" is a song with beautifully simple guitar picking. The song contains few lyrics but despite that still manages to be a clear message. He refers to it as a "sweet and naïve song" and says that the lyrics hold little meaning other than the desire to move on.

It captures feelings of freedom, individuality, and heartache, making it one of the band's most well known tracks. Stevie says that at the time she was very offended by the lyrics of the song, but has come to terms with what Lindsey calls the twin of "Dreams"

I never did believe in the ways of magic, But I'm beginning to wonder why Don't, break the spell It would be different and you know it will.



This song was brought to life by Stevie Nicks. I have never felt as though someone's pain, sorrow and rage has been conveyed so thoroughly. The way that the vocals slowly build intensity to match the beginning instrumentals tell a story. At the start Nicks sounds like a woman in love and denial. At the last time the chorus is sung her betrayal and rage is being fully displayed in the final crescendo. The lyrics that before sounded like heartbreak now sounding like a curse upon the man who broke her heart.

IN CONCLUSION

The album was hugely successful, hitting number one on the US Billboard 200 and selling over 40 million copies worldwide. It won the Grammy for Album of the Year in 1978 and is often seen as one of the greatest albums of all
